Missile Strikes Have Critically Damaged 50% Of Ukraine's Power Grids

Russia's widespread missile strikes have critically damaged Ukraine's power grids.

Ukrenergo, the giant thermal and hydroelectric power provider in Ukraine says that millions of its citizens are without power and water.

Energy company YASNO has announced that many families in Ukraine will suffer from the lack of electricity and consequently are deprived of heating until the spring of 2023.

Freezing weather has set in and temperatures have plummeted well below zero, celsius.

The fear that many will not survive the bitter cold, is not imaginary. Families

across Ukraine are seeking to obtain a wood-burning stove.

GCM's effort to provide these stoves to families in Ukraine is building momentum. To date, 1,800 wood-burning stoves have been built in three locations—in Zaporizhzhia, South Ukraine, in Ternopil, West Ukraine and the capital city, Kyiv.

In most areas of the country, there is no shortage of firewood. In low-lying, flat agricultural areas like Kherson however trees are scarce and firewood needs to be trucked in from other areas. Hardware stores in Ukraine do sell stoves for \$1,700 depending on the model. GCM is able to provide a stove to one family for \$100.

The Message of Christmas Reaches The Liberated City Of Kherson

The invasion of Ukraine by Russian forces stopped normal church ministry. Ukrainians continue to seek shelter in makeshift housing, community centers, bomb shelters, basements and hospitals.

Every Ukrainian refugee both inside and outside the country has one thing above all else on their mind, what is "the road back home" going to look like.

When Russia attacked Ukraine in February of this year GCMC was midway through its full scale media campaign in Eastern Ukraine. Overnight, the campaign changed. It morphed into a desperate push to reach the whole country. We re-wrote the all important campaign evangelism book and fine-tuned it for a nation at war.

"The Journey Home"

The campaign book contains the road map to new life in Jesus Christ, including the prayer of salvation for those wishing to take the step to reconcile their lives with God.

Soon after the invasion by Russia, the name

of the book was changed to read "The Journey Home." It points to a physical journey to a home that has been left behind or lost. But more importantly it refers to our spiritual journey to a lost relationship with our Heavenly Father. This book is our best gift to nation torn apart by this devastating war.

We have already printed and distributed about 100,000 copies but we urgently need to print 150,000 more. The cost of printing one book is \$2.50. The book is intentionally bilingual in both Ukrainian and Russian.

Liberation of Kherson
